Guidelines for funding applications to the Taranaki Tree Trust 2011

Criteria

The Trust will consider applications for the maintenance, restoration, enhancement or protection of;

- i) **Wetlands** - not identified as Regionally Significant, or otherwise included in schedules for protection under the Regional Freshwater Plan for Taranaki.
- ii) **Remnant areas of bush** - not identified as Significant Natural Areas (SNAs) or Key Native Ecosystems (KNEs) by District Councils or the Taranaki Regional Council.
- iii) **Indigenous vegetation on 'threatened land environments' and habitats of threatened indigenous species** not included within i) or ii).
- iv) **Dunelands, and other coastal ecosystem types, which are uncommon, rare or under threat or pressure from human activity.**
- v) **Amenity planting** - either indigenous or exotic, with a focus on schools and other public land.
- vi) **Projects, consistent with the objectives of the Trust Deed, which make a positive contribution to the community through protection, restoration or enhancement of the environment or the amenities of an area.**

Applications

- A Taranaki Tree Trust (the Trust) application form must be completed and submitted, following discussion with the Taranaki Tree Trust Co-ordinator.
- Additional information i.e. photographs, maps, drawings/plans, provides support to an application.
- Applications are considered at the meetings of the Trust.
- The meetings in 2011 are during; March, May, August and December.

Funding

- Only one application can be made to the Trust per financial year (1 July – 30 June).
- The minimum amount which can be applied for is \$300. The maximum amount which can be applied for is \$5,000.
- The Trust will contribute a maximum of 75% of the total cost of a project from a school or community group. The Trust will contribute a maximum of 50% of the total cost of a project on private land. The total cost includes cash, and the dollar value of any 'in kind' contributions from the applicant.
- The definition of a project is the work which occurs within one year.
- All funding applications are considered individually, and on their own merit. The Trustees retain the right to grant funds in greater or lesser amounts.
- The Trust encourages funding applications from community groups or private landowners undertaking work on land under formal protection i.e. covenant.

- Any funds provided by the Trust are for the specific purpose outlined in the applicant's funding application, and the application for funding letter to the applicant. The Trust retains the right to withhold funds, in part or full, from the applicant should it be proved the grant has been used for purposes NOT approved in the applicants funding application.
- Funds are to be uplifted/utilised within two (2) years of approval. Where funds are not uplifted/utilised in part or full within two (2) years, the Trust retains the right to return any/all funds to the Trust's Application Fund.
- Payment is made after all work outlined in the funding application has been completed, inspected, and a claim form approved by the Taranaki Tree Trust Co-ordinator or other authorised person.
- The applicant is required to provide copies of invoices charged directly to the applicant for costs associated with the approved funding application. The Trust's grant is provided as a rebate to the applicant. The Trust is not obliged to settle any creditor account charged directly to the Trust without prior approval from the Trust to the applicant.
- The applicant agrees to notify the Trust in writing should the grant not be required, or the project does not proceed.

Promotion

- The applicant agrees to acknowledge the support of the Trust in publicity material, and erect a Taranaki Tree Trust sign.

The cost of putting a plant in the ground with a good start is:

\$0.20 pre-plant spot spray **\$1.35** planting costs **\$0.30** post-planting release (spray) **\$1.85** Total cost/plant

Note: These costs are based on the landowner collecting the plants. If a Contractor collects the plants there is likely to be an additional cost of \$0.25-\$0.40 per plant.
