

### What we heard

### Key consultation themes:

- Safety at intersections.
- Urban speed zones and their locations were a concern.
- A desire for more urban cross opportunities.
- Community amenity access and active mode safety is a concern in all towns.
- Road surface condition.
- Safe access on and off SH3 in the 100km/h sections was a consistent theme.
- Narrow bridges were a concern for all (private vehicles users and transport industry).

# **Key findings**

#### Urban

- Urban/rural thresholds changes (location and speed).
- Urban roading environments should reflect their intended use.
- Additional crossing options have been identified\*.
- Urban speed has also been identified as an issue.
- School speed advisory opportunities were identified.

\*Community severance by SH3 and desire lines have been taken into consideration.



## **Key findings**

#### Rural

- > Head-on high-speed risks were identified as a consistent open road feature.
- > Risk of conflict in some passing lanes (sub-standard run-outs and property access conflict).
- High risk intersections such as Mangorie and Dudley and Junction Roads.
- > Roadside obstacles have also been identified as another risk theme through the corridor.

#### Overall

> The efficiency of the corridor has been assessed as having an acceptable level of service in its current form until 2030.

# **Next steps**

- > Consultation with community, councils and stakeholders late 2019.
- Completion of business case early 2020.
