
Taranaki 2050

Arbor Day excitement

Taranaki Enviroschools has been successful in our application for 1000 native trees to plant throughout Taranaki on or around Arbor Day (5 June) this year.

We've opened this up to all schools and kindergartens throughout Taranaki. Notifications about this have already gone out and we now have 37 community based actions happening. Woohoo! These trees will be planted either on school/ kindergarten grounds, along waterways to increase biodiversity, on farmland connecting nature corridors and for shade for stock or on community grounds to support dunes and/or hills. Don't forget to measure the areas planted and take those before and after photos for us. Have a great time planting!
