New plans for Pukeiti

It is now nine years since the partnership agreement between the Pukeiti Rhododendron Trust and the Taranaki Regional Council was signed and the running and ownership of the property was passed to the Regional Council. The original objectives of the Trust, accepted in full by the TRC, provide the basis and guiding principles for the further development of Pukeiti.

The TRC recognized that as a public garden, owned by all the ratepayers of Taranaki, no charge for entry would be levied .The developments, while not losing the focus on the gardens but instead enhancing them, have been aimed at increasing visitor numbers by introducing more family orientated activities, education programmes for schools and improving interpretation and public facilities like the Rainforest Café. In the last year of the Trust's management when a \$10 charge was levied for entry, Pukeiti attracted 10,000 visitors. Last year- now that the garden is free to enter - 86,000 visitors enjoyed this unique place. Development will continue and numbers will further increase.

For the next few years a number of initiatives are planned. A hiking and biking trail through Pukeiti, and then around the Kaitake Ranges to Oakura, is planned to be completed by 2022. Preceding this, next year a walking track along the old tramline on which logs were transported to the mill in the early 1900s will be further developed, and in 2021 a suspension bridge, the longest in New Zealand, will give outstanding views of the rainforest canopy and be an added attraction in itself. Also a stylishly designed family hut which will sleep 12 hikers is being constructed along the walkway on Pukeiti Hill.

Despite all this development the original purpose of Pukeiti, to develop a garden to display rhododendrons in a rainforest setting, incorporating an over-arching conservation ethic, has not been forgotten. The TRC has an extensive predator conservation programme which will boost native flora and fauna, and the ex-situ rhododendron project headed by the Trust will assist in the world-wide conservation of rhododendron species. The more practical steps in this project, the propagation and distribution of selected rhododendrons, would not be possible without the TRC's full support, which has been willingly given. The Trust provides advice and guidance through the Garden Forum, working closely with the staff on these matters. The TRC's provision of the new covered walk, the Vireya House, and the new garden features also supports the integrity of the rhododendron collection and improves its display.

The work at Pukeiti is led by Andrew Brooker in his new role of Plant Collections and Project Officer. The Trust provides a portion of his salary, reinforcing the partnership arrangements.

The TRC's predator control activities are already showing results with increased birdlife at Pukeiti and in the wider region.

Pukeiti continues on its journey to be a worldclass attraction and a place of international significance in conservation. It will continue to need your support.

GARDEN VISITS

SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 22

This year we are visiting gardens in central and south Taranaki.

Programme

9:00am – Meet at Tupare car park to organise car pooling.

10:00am – Gather at Cairnhill Garden, 1054 SH43, Stratford. Turn inland from Stratford on SH43 (also called Regan Street) heading towards Taumarunui. June and Colin Lees garden is about 15 minutes down this highway.

This is a tranquil, park-like garden all on one level. Over the past 50 years the garden has steadily expanded around the house. Over 100 varieties of rhododendrons grow happily under deciduous trees and amongst camellias, clematis, roses and lots of different hostas.

11:30am - King Edward Park, Waihi Road, Hawera. (Park by the swimming pool)

STDC parks curator, David Bruce, will guide us on a tour of this public garden which gained its fifth star from the NZ Gardens' Trust recently.

1:00pm - Puketarata Garden, 14 Ngawhini Road, Hawera. We will have our lunch here before viewing the garden. Jennifer Horner is the granddaughter of Pukeiti's founding chairman, Griff Williams. Starting in 1978, she and her husband Ken have created just under 1 hectare of garden rooms nestled in a hillside contour. The garden is planted with both natives and exotics and includes formal plantings, vege gardens, stunning views and a bush gully that has a QEII covenant over it.

3:00pm – Openlands, 1064 Auroa Road, Manaia.

We will finish the day at Marie Mill's wonderful country garden. Here, broad sweeping lawns are edged by perennial borders filled with rhododendrons, camellias and large trees. The garden is full of surprises such as a shade house, native dell and even an old Methodist church now used as a wedding venue.

At the conclusion of the garden tour we will settle down for fellowship and conviviality and enjoy Marie's hospitality.

Lucy and I, also known as 'The Lucys' have been working and living at Pukeiti for the last 2 months. We have been in New Zealand since November 2018 on sabbatical from our roles as horticulturalists in the Rainforest Biome of the Eden Project, UK. During our time in New Zealand we have worked in several different gardens and traveled the country visiting as many places as possible to learn about the plants of New Zealand, how gardens are managed here and some of the amazing conservation work happening within the country.

Our time at Pukeiti has been fantastic! It is very exciting to be here with all the project developments at Pukeiti and the surrounding rainforest. We have been working on maintaining the stunning new covered walkway with its subtropical foliage beautifully highlighting the vireya collection, overhauling the beds in the Founder's Lawn and working with the team to bring inspiration and fresh ideas to planning and designing the new beds around The Lodge.

We have also been able to visit and work in Hollard Gardens and Tupare. Both locations are so unique and it was great to learn about food production in the productive display at Hollards and the history of the collection and house at Tupare. We were also lucky enough to be able to help the Head Gardener Mitch with teaching about his Garden Design workshop at Tupare which was a really enjoyable experience for us.

We have genuinely loved working at Pukeiti. The combination of rhodos and native bush is beautiful and so complementary. We have also had a great time learning about some of the hidden gems in the collection such as the native and miniscule Corybas orchid flowers and the shade loving mountain foxglove, Ourisia macrophylla. We have particularly enjoyed seeing the largeleaf rhodos and vireya collection come into flower with such incredible displays! When we first arrived, Rhododendron 'Pukeiti' was just bursting into flower with buds bigger than my fist and the white sweet scented trumpet shaped flowers of R. goodenoughii was in full bloom in the Vireya Walkway.

It has been very inspiring to work with such enthusiastic and passionate professionals who love the collections they manage. Everyone has been so welcoming and made our time here really special. Pukeiti and Taranaki has been a real highlight of our time in New Zealand and we will definitely stay in touch with Pukeiti when we return to the UK, keeping this international connection going.



Pukeiti Tour of English Gardens



Commencing late April through to late May this special tour is designed to explore the very finest of Southern England including special gardens in North Wales, East Anglia, the Cotswolds, South West and South East, finishing up with the Chelsea Flower Show in London. As an appetiser two nights will be spent in Singapore visiting the spectacular Bay Gardens and the Botanic and Orchid Gardens in this iconic city, on the way over.

The itinerary includes:

- Hyde Hall, Beth Chatto Gardens, Raveningham Hall and East Ruston Old Vicarage in East Anglia.
- Chatsworth, Bodnant, Maenan Hall and Plas Brondanw in Central England and North Wales.
- Hidcote Manor, Kiftsgate Court, Hampton Court Castle, Stockton Bury, Highgrove Royal Estate, Miserden Park, The Laskett and Old Rectory Thruxton in the Cotswolds and Gloucestershire.
- Hestercombe, Knightshayes Court, Rosemoor, Castle Hill, Killerton, The Garden House and Wildside Garden in Devon.
- Eden Garden, Tregrehan, Caerhays Castle, Trewithen in Cornwall, with an option to Scilly Isles or St Michaels Mount.
- Abbotsbury, Exbury, Hillier Arboretum along the South Coast.
- Leonardslee, Nymans, Sissinghurst, Great Dixter, Wakehurst Place and Borde Hill in South East.
- Great Comp, Wisley, Kew and Savill Gardens near London, with Chelsea Flower Show to finish.



The UK tour includes share twin/double accommodation with dinner, bed and breakfast, garden entries, coach travel. Early visit to Sissinghurst, evening visit with tour and dinner at Wisley, guided tours to Hestercombe, Caerhays, Rosemoor and Kew. Chelsea show ticket. Brightwater Tour Manager.

Rhododendrons have always been regarded as the elite plants of the garden, and the big-leaf rhododendrons are the giants of the family, both literally and figuratively.


This book explores how these amazing plants were discovered, provides practical tips on propagation and cultivation, and looks at conservation in a garden situation as well as in the wild.


