Purpose

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to advise the Council of consents granted, consents under application and of consent processing actions since the last meeting. This information is summarised in attachments at the end of this report.

Executive summary

2. Memorandum to advise the Council of recent consenting actions made under regional plans and the Resource Management Act 1991, in accordance with Council procedures and delegations.

Recommendations

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

a) <u>receives</u> the schedule of resource consents granted and other consent processing actions, made under delegated authority.

Background

- 3. The attachments show resource consent applications, certificates of compliance and deemed permitted activities that have been investigated and decisions made by officers of the Taranaki Regional Council. They are activities having less than minor adverse effects on the environment, or having minor effects where affected parties have agreed to the activity. In accordance with sections 87BB, 104 to 108 and 139 of the Resource Management Act 1991, and pursuant to delegated authority to make these decisions, the Chief Executive or the Director Resource Management, has allowed the consents, certificates of compliance and deemed permitted activities.
- 4. The exercise of delegations under the Resource Management Act 1991 is reported for Members' information. Under the delegations manual, consent processing actions are to be reported to the Consents and Regulatory Committee.

- 5. In addition to the details of the activity consented, the information provided identifies the Iwi whose rohe (area of interest) the activity is in. If the activity is in an area of overlapping rohe both Iwi are shown. If the activity is within, adjacent to, or directly affecting a statutory acknowledgement (area of special interest), arising from a Treaty settlement process with the Crown, that is also noted.
- 6. Also shown, at the request of Iwi members of the Council, is a summary of the engagement with Iwi and Hapū, undertaken by the applicant and the Council during the application process. Other engagement with third parties to the consent process is also shown. The summary shows the highest level of involvement that occurred with each party. For example, a party may have been consulted by the applicant, provided with a copy of the application by the Council, served notice as an affected party, lodged a submission and ultimately agreed with the consent conditions. In that case the summary would show only 'agreed with consent conditions', otherwise reporting becomes very complicated.
- 7. The attachment titled 'Consent Processing Information' includes the figure 'Consent Applications in Progress' which shows the total number of applications in the consent processing system over the last twelve months. The number of applications for the renewal of resource consents is also shown. The difference between the two is the number of new applications, including applications for a change of consent conditions. New applications take priority over renewal applications. Renewal applications are generally put on hold, with the agreement of the applicant, and processed when staff resources allow. A consent holder can continue to operate under a consent that is subject to renewal. The above approach is pragmatic and ensures there are no regulatory impediments to new activities requiring authorisation.
- 8. The attachment also includes:
 - Applications in progress table the number of applications in progress at the end of
 each month (broken down into total applications and the number of renewals in
 progress) for this year and the previous two years
 - Potential hearings table outlining the status of applications where a hearing is anticipated and the decision maker(s) (e.g. a hearing panel) has been appointed
 - Consents issued table the number of consents issued at the end of each month for this year and the previous two years
 - Breakdown of consents issued. This is the number of consents issued broken down by purpose – new, renewals, changes or review
 - Types of consents issued, further broken down into notification types nonnotified, limited notified or public notified
 - Number of times that the public and iwi were involved in an application process for the year so far
 - Application processing time extensions compared to the previous years
 - Consent type process shows the notification type including applications submitted on and the pre-hearing resolution numbers
 - Applications that have been returned because they are incomplete.

Decision-making considerations

9. Part 6 (Planning, decision-making and accountability) of the *Local Government Act* 2002 has been considered and documented in the preparation of this agenda item. The recommendations made in this item comply with the decision-making obligations of the *Act*.

Financial considerations—LTP/Annual Plan

10. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's adopted Long-Term Plan and estimates. Any financial information included in this memorandum has been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

Policy considerations

11. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the policy documents and positions adopted by this Council under various legislative frameworks including, but not restricted to, the *Local Government Act* 2002, the *Resource Management Act* 1991 and the *Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act* 1987.

lwi considerations

12. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's policy for the development of Māori capacity to contribute to decision-making processes (schedule 10 of the *Local Government Act* 2002) as outlined in the adopted long-term plan and/or annual plan. Similarly, iwi involvement in adopted work programmes has been recognised in the preparation of this memorandum.

Legal considerations

13. This memorandum and the associated recommendations comply with the appropriate statutory requirements imposed upon the Council.

Response and considerations during processing of application

Council provided TKoTA with a copy of consent 0436-3, advised of the relevant rule the consent was to be processed under, provided a summary of the applicant's compliance history and provided comments on the application from Council's Land and Water Scientist, Ray West.

Council advised the applicant that a site of significance to Maori was 400 m downstream of the proposed activity site and that the stormwater discharged to a statutory acknowledgement area of Te Atiawa. Council advised the applicant that although engagement was not a requirement of the applicant, best practise would be to engage with TKoTA, Manukorihi Hapū and Otaraua Hapū. The applicant subsequently approached TKoTA as outlined below under 'Consultation carried out by the Applicant'.

Consultation and a cultural effects assessment was not a requirement of the applicant as effects related to Tangata whenua values is not a matter of control for Council to consider when setting conditions. This engagement may have led to the applicant volunteering alterations to their application and processes to mitigate adverse cultural effects of the proposal, however this did not result and the applicant chose to proceed with the processing of the application.

Te Kotahitanga o Te Atiawa Trust Consulted by applicant

Consultation carried out by the Applicant

Consultation was not undertaken with iwi by the applicant prior to the application being submitted. Iwi commented on the application.

The applicant met with a representative from Manukorihi Hapū and a representative from Te Kotahitanga o Te Atiawa on 1 June 2022, after the application had been submitted to Council. The representative from Otaraua Hapū was unable to attend.

The applicant took the iwi and hapū representatives through the documentation that had previously been sent to Council and showed them around the site.

When the representatives left, they advised that they would brief Otaraua Hapū on the meeting and then provide comment to Council on the application.

Comments from Ngāruahine

- There has been no pre-application consultation from the applicant with Te Korowai.
- Te Korowai acknowledges this application is for a renewal of a discharge permit to land with existing storage. This aligns with bottom lines of Te Uru Taiao o Ngāruahine which opposes discharges of any type directly to water bodies within the rohe of Ngāruahine.
- It is Te Korowai's expectation, stormwater is managed on site and not discharged into rivers or natural wetlands per Policy 1.8 of the Taiao Plan.
- It appears the Mangapapa Stream flows through the application site therefore, Te Korowai will advocate for the fencing and riparian planting along all tributaries to the Kaupokonui Stream to provide the maximum protection available to these valued waterways.

These comments were taken into consideration through the consent process and were passed on to the Riparian Land Management Team.

Consultation

The proposed activity is within the rohe of Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi. The Council sent a copy of the application to them in accordance with agreed procedure on 2 May 2022.

Council emailed Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi on 18 May to enquire whether they had any concerns or comments regarding the application. Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi replied that they would appreciate some more time to be able to provide comments. The applicant agreed to a ten day extension to enable this.

A hui was held between Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi and Ngāti Hou tipua hapū representitives, the Consenting Officer and Jane Harvey on 3 June 2022 at the request of Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi. During this hui Iwi and hapū representatives raised their concerns to Council regarding the application and requested their values be understood through a Cultural Values Assessment (CVA), to be commissioned by the applicant.

In response Council's Groundwater Scientist spoke to alleviate concerns of iwi and hapū from a technical perspective. I stated that the CVA may not be appropriate for the scale and significance of the proposal but that I would consider the request and run it through Council's Consents Manager.

Ultimately it was decided that a Cultural Values Assessment could not be considered when determining the duration or conditions of this consent, considering the proposal was to be assessed as a controlled activity and effects relating to tangata whenua values are listed as not a matter of control for Council under the RFWP.

A Cultural Values Assessment was submitted by Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi and Ngāti Hou tipua hapū to provide an assessment of their values against this activity and how it impacts their values. This document was commissioned by Council and may be referred to in the future for similar water take applications that Council may receive, where full discretion can be exercised, or where reserved control relates to tangata whenua values.

Consultation carried out by the Applicant

Prior to lodgement of this consent application a copy of the application was shared with Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi for their feedback and comment. To date there has been no feedback. The applicant stated in their application that they will continue to engage with Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi and inform Council of any relevant information associated with this consent application. No parties other than Ngaa Rauru Kiitahi have been considered to be interested with the proposal, therefore no consultation with any other parties has been undertaken.

The proposed activity is in the rohe of Te Atiawa. The CMA is also a statutory acknowledgement of Te Atiawa. The Council sent a copy of the application to them in accordance with agreed procedure. The Iwi/hapu prepared a Cultural Impact Assessment (CIA) for both the New Plymouth District Council consent application and this application, which included the following comments:

- The existing environment includes Ngāti Te Whiti, mana whenua for the area;
- Ensuring there is a Ngāti Te Whiti perspective and voice within consent and monitoring processes is critical to ensuring a more complete understanding of the existing environment as it may change over time:
- A number of potential adverse effects may result from the proposal, including:
 - a) Limiting the ability of Ngāti Te Whiti to undertake our role as kaitiaki;
 - b) Exacerbation of the poor health of tangaroa;
 - c) Impacts on native fauna which utilise the area, and their ability to persist in these areas;
 - d) Erosion of the cultural landscape;
 - e) The re-discovery of archaeological sites or areas during construction works.

The report also made the following recommendations:

- The proposed firefighting towers be relocated outside of the view shafts of importance to Ngāti Te Whiti:
- Annual monitoring of the seafloor area where the wave tower was located be undertaken;
- A condition requiring a kaitiaki forum;
- A condition requiring testing of the firefighting system be undertaken in accordance with the consent application;
- A condition requiring a Korora Management Plan.

In response to the recommendations in the CIA, the following comments were made by Council's Consents Officer:

- The applicant has confirmed that they are unable to change the location of the proposed monitors. A lot of technical information (and modelling) was undertaken to determine the location in terms of reach, target range, and winds, and the need to meet the fire system requirements;
- Annual monitoring of the seafloor is outside the scope of the current application removal of the
 wave tower was undertaken under the emergency works provisions of the RMA, and a retrospective
 consent was not required;
- The applicant confirmed that this consent will be included on the agenda of the existing Kaitiaki forum:
- Recommended conditions include those regarding testing of the firefighting monitors, and the Korora Management Plan.

Since lodging the application, the applicant has continued to liaise with Ngāti Te Whiti regarding the CIA recommendations. Ngāti Te Whiti subsequently revised the CIA (a copy was provided to the Council on 28 June 2022) which now states that the hapu are comfortable with the siting and height of the proposed monitors.

The revised CIA also includes an additional recommendation that the existing monitors are removed prior to the proposed monitors being fully operational. However the applicant has stated that this is not possible as there must be a compliant firefighting system in place, and the existing monitors have to remain in service until the new system is operational. Therefore the existing monitors will be removed at a later date.



The site is well planted and although the plantings are not native, they do mitigate effects as far as practicable. It is not practicable to replace the existing planting with natives. The Mangaoraka Stream, which is a statutory acknowledgement, and a pa site are located about 400 m to the east of the sheds.

The discharge is not within or adjacent to the Mangaoraka Stream and at a distance of 400 m does not directly affect it. Similarly, it does not affect the pa site.

Te Atiawa indicated a wish to be treated as an affected party. However, after having regard for the statutory acknowledgement, and assessing the effects of the discharge and the specific comments about effects that they provided, the Consents Manager when making the notification decision was satisfied that any effect on Te Atiawa would be less than minor.



- 2. The annual inspection for farm dairy effluent monitoring programme commences in September each year and usually finishes around March, however follow up inspections and winter milking inspections are also carried out during the rest of the year.

Executive summary

Incidents

- 3. There are sixty five (65) incidents reported.
- 4. Thirty three (33) of the incidents were found to be compliant and seventeen (17) were found to be non-compliant. Fifteen (15) of the incidents reported relate to non-compliances from previous periods (updates). The action taken on the incidents is set out for Members information.
- 5. For the thirteenth reporting period in a row there continues to be a high number of incidents found to be compliant.
- 6. There were a total of five hundred and thirty one (531) incidents responded to in the 2021-2022 year.

Compliance monitoring non-compliances

- 7. There are fifteen (15) compliance monitoring non-compliances reported. Two (2) of the compliance monitoring non-compliances reported are updates from previous periods.
- 8. Five (5) of the non-compliances reported are as a result of the annual dairy inspection round.

9. There were one hundred and thirty seven (137) compliance monitoring non-compliances found during the 2021-2022 year.

Recommendations

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

- a) <u>receives</u> this memorandum *Incident*, *Compliance Monitoring Non-Compliances and Enforcement Summary 18 May 2022 to 30 June 2022*
- b) <u>receives</u> the summary of the incidents, compliance monitoring non-compliances and enforcement for the period from 18 May 2022 to 30 June 2022, <u>notes</u> the action taken by staff acting under delegated authority and adopts the recommendations therein.

Background

- 10. The Council receives and responds to pollution events and public complaints throughout the year. Consent compliance monitoring undertaken can also identify non-compliance. This information is recorded in the IRIS database together with the results of investigations and any follow-up actions. Such incidents and non-compliances are publicly reported to the Council through the Consents and Regulatory Committee via the Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement Report or the Annual Compliance Monitoring Reports.
- 11. Attached is the summary of the Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement for the period from 18 May 2022 to 30 June 2022.
- 12. Staff have been delegated by the Council to undertake enforcement actions. The enforcement policy and procedures are approved by the Council and then consistently implemented and reported on by staff.

Disclosure Restrictions

13. The incident register information presentation was reviewed in 2014-2015 to increase reader understanding in this complex area. The first section addresses compliant incidents and can be publicly discussed. The second section provides an update on noncompliant incidents from previous meetings and where an incident has been resolved it can be publicly discussed. The third and fourth sections provide information on noncompliant incidents and non-compliances found during compliance monitoring during the period that are still under investigation and staff are limited in terms of public disclosure of information, while the investigation is ongoing and enforcement responses have not been determined. The incident flow chart and definition of terms provide further operational detail.

Discussion

14. Council responds to all complaints received with most complaints responded to within four hours. This usually involves a site visit. Responses to complaints and non-compliances with rules in the Council's regional plans, resource consents and the Resource Management Act 1991 are recorded in the IRIS database. Where necessary, appropriate advisory or enforcement actions are undertaken. The latter may include issuing an inspection, abatement or infringement notice, or initiating a prosecution. Where an infringement notice or prosecution is possible, details of the information in the Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement agenda item and

- staff comment will be restricted for legal disclosure reasons. Further information will be provided at a later date to the Council and for prosecutions a detailed report will be provided for information purposes, in the confidential section of the agenda.
- 15. A summary of Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement for the period 18 May 2022 o 30 June 2022 is attached. The 'compliant' incidents are presented first in a table and the 'non-compliant' incidents are presented after in a more detailed summary, followed by the compliance monitoring non-compliances.
- 16. Generally, incidents in the 'compliant' table have a recommendation of 'no further action'. However, an incident is considered 'compliant' until such time as a non-compliance is found. Therefore, occasionally an incident in the 'compliant' table will have a recommendation of 'investigation continuing', if an ongoing investigation is still underway to confirm compliance.
- 17. A series of graphs are also attached comparing the number of incidents between 2016-2017 and 2021-2022, and also showing how the incidents are tracking in 2021-2022 in relation to environment type and compliance status. There is a graph showing the non-compliances found during compliance monitoring. There is also a graph showing enforcement action taken to date during 2021-2022.
- 18. The data in the graphs for 2021-2022 to date is showing that there are more incidents but less compliance monitoring non-compliances. Although in the first month of this period, there is limited data.

Decision-making considerations

19. Part 6 (Planning, decision-making and accountability) of the *Local Government Act* 2002 has been considered and documented in the preparation of this agenda item. The recommendations made in this item comply with the decision-making obligations of the *Act*.

Financial considerations—LTP/Annual Plan

20. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's adopted Long-Term Plan and estimates. Any financial information included in this memorandum has been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

Policy considerations

21. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the policy documents and positions adopted by this Council under various legislative frameworks including, but not restricted to, the *Local Government Act* 2002, the *Resource Management Act* 1991 and the *Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act* 1987.

Iwi considerations

22. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's policy for the development of Māori capacity to contribute to decision-making processes (schedule 10 of the *Local Government Act* 2002) as outlined in the adopted long-term plan and/or annual plan. Similarly, iwi involvement in adopted work programmes has been recognised in the preparation of this memorandum.

Community considerations

23. This memorandum and the associated recommendations have considered the views of the community, interested and affected parties and those views have been recognised in the preparation of this memorandum.

Legal considerations




