## Fruit trees

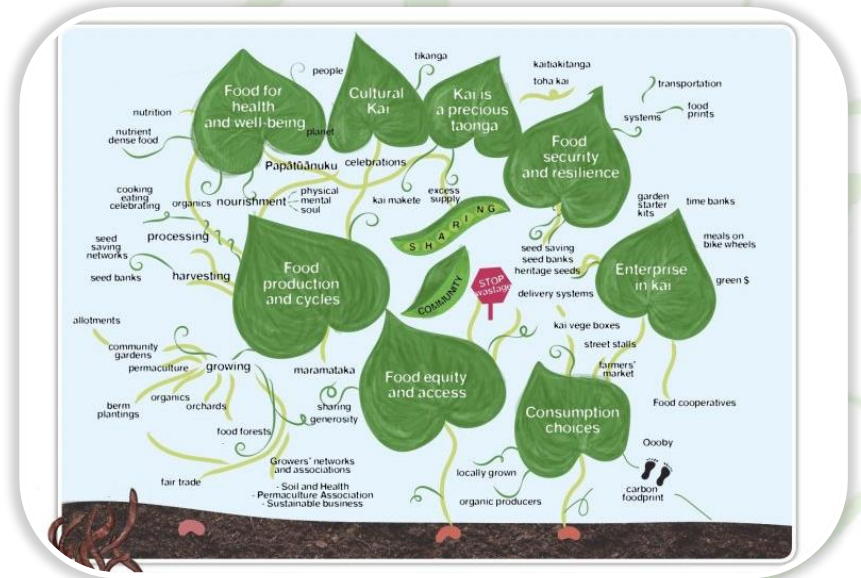

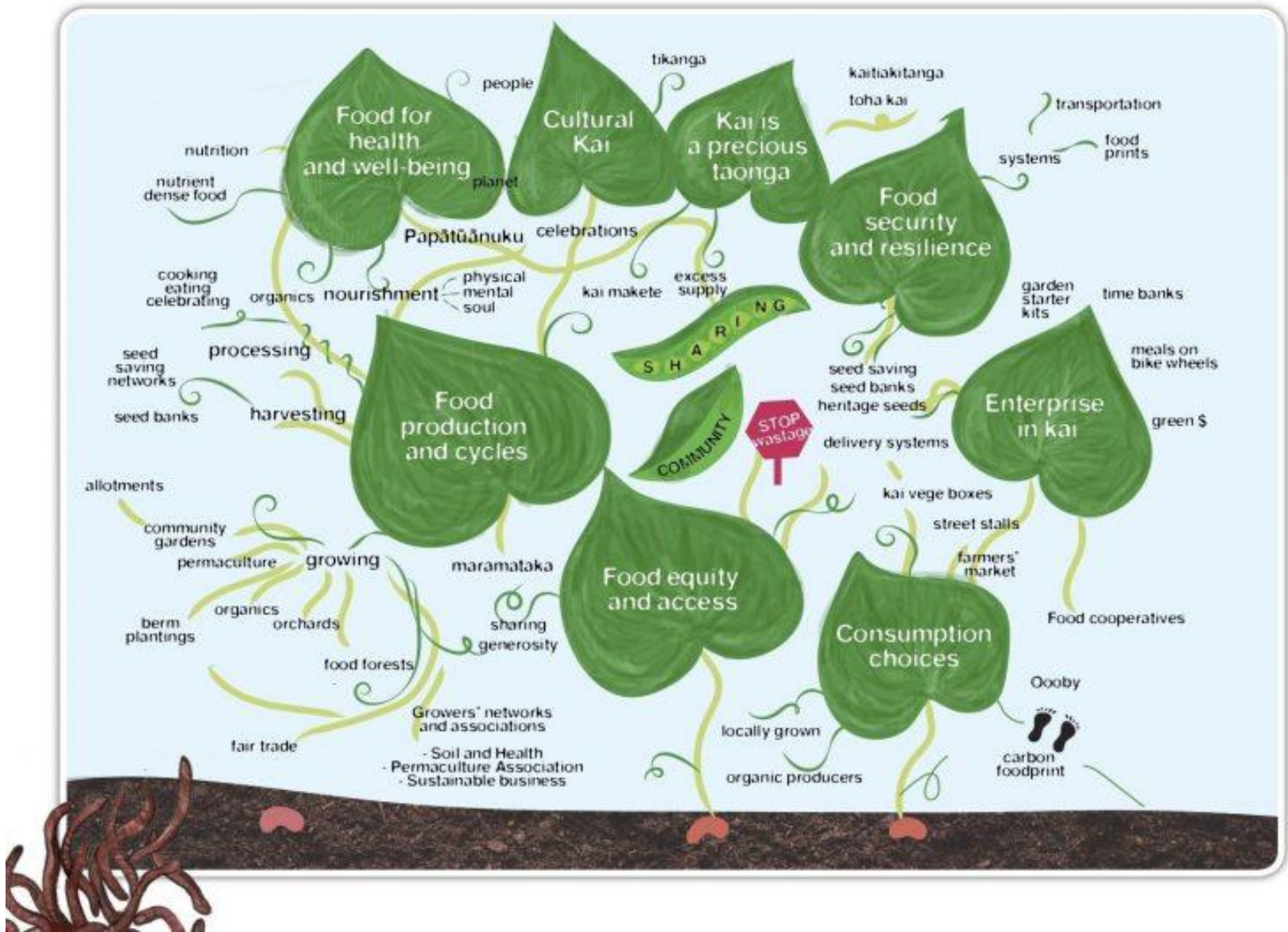

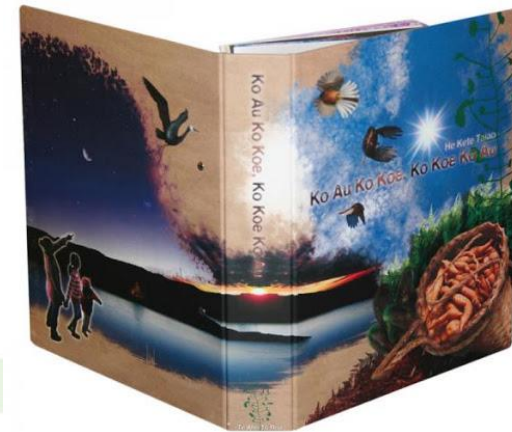
